



Chinese Chestnut
Castanea mollissima

sweet nuts with many culinary possibilities
drought tolerant
can grow in highly acid, infertile dry sands
35 - 55 lbs. of nuts each year from mature trees
fruits 5 - 7 years from seed
height – to 40'





Heartnut
Japanese Walnut
Juglans cordifolia

sweet nut, ripens in September
requires full sun, rich sandy soil with good drainage
height: 20' - 30'



Butternut
Juglans cinerea

sweet, rich-tasting kernel
small meat, hard to crack
tall tree - to 80'



Buartnut
(Butternut and
Heartnut cross)
Juglans x bisbyi

hybrid vigor
heavy bearing
superior hardiness
disease resistant
height: to 40'





Shellbark Hickory *Carya laciniosa*

sweet tasting nuts with maple syrup overtones
native tree, 60' – 90'



Northern Pecan
Carya illinoensis

delicious nuts
easily cracked
native tree
height: 60' – 90'





Hican

Pecan X Hickory
Carya illinoensis x
ovata

hickory nut flavor
easily shelled
native tree
height: 50' – 70'





Hardy Almond
Prunus amygdalus

ornamental
sweet to slightly bitter nuts
grows where peaches thrive
height: to 20'





Korean Nut Pine
Pinus koraiensis

buttery, rich flavor; in salads and pesto
good shelter tree
thrives wherever white pine can grow
needs shade for first 2 years
tall tree – to 90'





Hazelnut

Corylus avellana hybrids

excellent for eating raw or in baked goods

highly nutritious

thrives in a variety of soil types

shrub, 12' – 20'
